Presumption: We presume so much in life. For example, if a young person gets good grades in school, we presume they will go to college and do well. When that student may be working harder than ever so they can graduate from high school. Their dreams and aspirations may entail them going to a trade school to become an electrician. Making presumptions can put others in a box they were never meant to fit. Honestly, I do not think anyone was meant to fit in a box.

If an adolescent boy is tall for his age many presume, he is active in sports. When they find out that he is a part of the speech and debate team, they wonder whether the basketball team somehow missed one. Because I am Italian, people presume I know how to make great pasta dishes, I do, but placing me in a stereotype because of my ethnicity is simply wrong. When I was going to college studying Church Ministry, many presumed that I already knew Greek so learning Biblical Greek would be easier for me. but it wasn't.

Living as an adolescent in the foster-care program many presumed all of us young people were troublemakers. Allegedly some of us were. However, most of us were kids being thrust into adult situations that we did not know how to work through. Some of us learned how to navigate the mayhem by learning from those who had been in the system for a while, we presumed they knew what they were doing. At the very least they knew more about how things worked than we did.

Teachers, administrators, and even counselors presumed that foster kids were going to be a problem when we entered their school. They would watch and wait for us to do something wrong. It felt like they savored disciplining kids who were already struggling with exceedingly difficult life issues. What a difference they could have made by building trust and befriending a hurt child.

Philistine cursed David by his gods. 44 "Come here," he said, "and I'll give your flesh to the birds of the air and the beasts of the field!" ~ 1 Samuel 17:41 - 44

The story of David and Goliath is one of my favorites, the little guy is more than a conqueror as he defeats a giant. When Goliath looked to see whom the Israelites were sending to face him, he laughed, he mocked, and he presumed that this would be no battle at all. In his mind, Goliath presumed he was going to pulverize the little guy. Nothing in what he saw in David indicated that he was up to the task. The rest of the Israelite army was sitting in the background shaking in their armor, and they were not even standing toe-to-toe with the massive Philistine. Not only did Goliath believe himself to be superior to David, but he also thought his pagan gods were greater than the God of the Israelites.

Goliath's presumption led to him being defeated and decapitated. His assessment of who David was, was lacking. He had faced warriors and defeated them with ease. David seemed like nothing more than an adolescent child. In his mind, he must have questioned the sanity of the Israelite king. We must know that presumption can get us in so much trouble. Far too often presumption leaves very little room for grace. compassion, and love.

What presumptions have you made or are you making that might not be fair to another in your life? What will you need to do to change your mindset, and how you interact with that individual? My prayer for each of us is that we will move beyond presumptions and genuinely love those God has placed within our lives.
